Plaintiffs-Petitioners Michael Anderson and Robert G. Barber ("Plaintiffs") respectfully move this Court to expedite its consideration of the Petition for Original Jurisdiction ("Petition") and Complaint filed contemporaneously herewith and incorporated herein by reference. In support of this motion, Plaintiffs would respectfully show until this Court as follows:

- 1. This matter involves the pending certification of certain individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to become candidates for the South Carolina House of Representatives, the South Carolina Senate, or a countywide office. Consequently, this matter seeks to resolve questions surrounding the state primary elections scheduled for June 12, 2012 and the integrity of this state's election process, which is a matter of serious public interest and concern.
- In considering whether individuals seeking to be nominated should be certified, political parties are required to verify whether those individuals have complied with certain provisions of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act of 1991, as amended. Specifically, political parties must ensure that those individuals filed an Statement of Economic Interests ("SEI") concurrent with their filing of an Statement of Intention of Candidacty ("SIC"). See S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B) ("A candidate must file a statement of economic interests for the preceding calendar year at the same time and with the same official with whom the candidate files a declaration of candidacy.") (emphasis supplied). Moreover, "an officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy ... may not accept a declaration of candidacy ... unless the declaration ... is accompanied by a statement of economic interests." S.C. Code § 8-13-1356(E) (emphasis supplied). If a candidate fails to file a statement of economic interests but the candidates name inadvertently appears on the ballot, "the officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy or petitions for nomination must not certify the candidate subsequent to the election." Id. (emphasis supplied).
- 3. As more fully shown in the Petition and Complaint filed contemporaneously herewith, and upon information and belief, numerous individuals seeking to be nominated as a candidate through political party primaries failed to file an SEI at the

same time and with the same official with whom they attempted to file their SIC. Specifically, these individuals did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission at all, or, at most, until some period of time after the filing of their SIC.

- 4. Because these individuals failed to file an SEI as required by S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B), these individuals did not comply with the statutorily mandated methods of becoming candidates for office by political party primary and Respondents LCDP, LCRP, SCDP and SCRP were required by statute to refuse their SIC. Moreover, because these individuals were required to file an SEI concurrently with their SIC, but failed to do so, these individuals are not qualified or eligible to seek nomination by political party primary for the respective offices.
- 5. Notwithstanding the disqualification and ineligibility of these and other individuals to seek the nomination to be a candidate for these various offices, upon information and belief, the LCDP, the LCRP, the SCDP, the SCRP, and other county political parties accepted the deficient filings of these and other individuals and provided written certification to the State Commission or Lexington Commission that these individuals met the qualifications for the office for which the individual desired to file.
- 6. Consequently, as reflected in the Petition for Original Jurisdiction and Complaint filed contemporaneously with this motion, Plaintiffs seek, *inter alia*, a declaration individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office who failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC are disqualified from appearing on the State Primary ballot and are ineligible to seek the nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office.

7. This matter implicates the validity of this State's election process and, thus, is a matter of critical public importance. A timely resolution to this question is critical to ensuring the validity of the upcoming primary elections and ensuring the validity of the general election should one of these purported candidates prevail in a primary election and appear on the general election ballot.

8. Given that the primary elections will be held less than two months away, this matter involves questions of the utmost urgency. Delay in this Court's adjudication of the issue could be detrimental to the integrity of the mandated election process. Therefore, the Petitioners respectfully assert that such an important issue should be decided immediately by this State's highest court.

WHEREFORE, having fully set forth their motion, Plaintiffs-Petitioners move the Court to expedite its consideration by granting the Petition for Original Jurisdiction and scheduling an expedited schedule for responding to the Complaint and briefing this matter for argument, and further request that this Court grant to them such other and further relief as is just and proper.

PETITION FOR ORIGINAL JURISDICTION

The above-named Petitioners submit this Petition for Original Jurisdiction pursuant to Article V, section 5, of the South Carolina Constitution, Section 14-3-310 of the South Carolina Code, and South Carolina Appellate Court Rule 245. A proposed Complaint is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. In accordance with Rule 245(a), this Petition is further supplemented by the Affidavits of Petitioners Michael

Anderson and Robert Barger and other referenced documents attached to the Complaint as Exhibits 1 through 15.

Introduction

As explained below and in the Complaint filed contemporaneously with this Petition, this controversy involves the pending certification of certain individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to become candidates for the South Carolina House of Representatives ("House of Representatives"), the South Carolina Senate ("Senate"), or a countywide office. The individuals identified herein as well as other individuals on both the state and county levels, attempted to declare as candidates but failed to file a Statement of Economic Interests form ("SEI") at the same time and with the same official with whom the individuals filed a declaration of candidacy or petition for nomination as required by S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B). Consequently, these individuals did not comply with the filing requirements to become candidates seeking nomination to these offices in the party primary currently scheduled for June 12, 2012, and may not properly appear on the election ballots for the Democratic and Republican Primary Elections.

Petitioners assert that this matter is appropriate for consideration in this Court's original jurisdiction and that this Court should grant the petition and entertain this controversy in its original jurisdiction. This matter requires a determination of whether certain individuals have properly filed a Statement of Intention of Candidacy ("SIC"), including the required SEI, and, thus, whether those individuals properly may be candidates in the upcoming primary elections and appear on the ballot in the upcoming primary elections. This matter also involves application of the statutes enacted by the

General Assembly governing the process of filing for elections and appearing on the ballot for elections.

In short, this matter involves questions surrounding the integrity of this State's election process, which is a matter of serious public interest and concern. Moreover, given that the primary elections are scheduled for June 12, 2012, less than two months away, and that ballots are scheduled to be mailed not later than April 28, 2012, this matter involves questions of the utmost urgency, requiring this Court's attention without further delay and an expedited briefing and argument schedule. Petitioners assert that the facts are not materially in dispute and, thus, that this Court's attention will not be required to resolve factual disputes but instead may be focused upon the application of two statutes governing the process for timely filing to become a candidate, sections 7-11-15 and 8-13-1356, and maintaining the integrity of this State's election process.

Support for Granting Petition

In support of this Petition, the Petitioners would respectfully show as follows:

- 1. Petitioner Michael Anderson is a resident and citizen of Lexington, South Carolina, and is qualified and registered to vote in the State primary election currently scheduled for June 12, 2012 ("State Primary"). By virtue of his residency, Petitioner Anderson is qualified to vote in the State Primary for those individuals seeking nomination to become candidates for offices in Lexington County, including the office of Lexington County Coroner.
- 2. Petitioner Robert G. Barger is a resident and citizen of Lexington, South Carolina, and is qualified and registered to vote in the State Primary. By virtue of his

residency, Petitioner Barger is qualified to vote in the State Primary for those individuals seeking nomination to become candidates for House of Representatives District 88 and Senate Election District 23.

- 3. Respondent South Carolina Election Commission ("Commission") is an agency of the government of the State of South Carolina and an entity charged with carrying out the authority conferred upon it by the South Carolina Election Law, S.C. Code Ann. § 7-1-10, et seq.
- 4. Respondent Marci Andino is the duly appointed Executive Director and representative of the Commission.
- 5. Respondent South Carolina Democratic Party ("SCDP") is a political party certified by the Commission to nominate candidates for offices to be voted on in a general or special election and nominates candidates of that party on a regular basis by party primary.
- 6. Respondent Richard A. Harpootlian is the duly appointed or elected Chairman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the SCDP.
- 7. Respondent South Carolina Republican Party ("SCRP") is a political party certified by the Commission to nominate candidates for offices to be voted on in a general or special election and nominates candidates of that party on a regular basis by party primary.
- 8. Respondent Chad Connelly is the duly appointed or elected Chairman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the SCRP.
- 9. Respondent Lexington County Commission of Registration and Elections ("Lexington Commission") is an agency of the government of the State of South Carolina

and of Lexington County and is an entity charged with carrying out the authority conferred upon it by the South Carolina Election Law, S.C. Code Ann. § 7-1-10, et seq.

- 10. Respondent Dean Crepes is the duly appointed Executive Director and representative of the Lexington Commission.
- 11. Respondent Lexington County Democratic Party ("LCDP") is a county committee of SCDP.
- 12. Respondent Kathy Hensley is the duly appointed or elected Chairwoman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the LCDP.
- 13. Respondent Lexington County Republican Party ("LCRP") is a county committee of the SCRP.
- 14. Respondent Steven Isom is the duly appointed or elected Chairman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the LCRP.
- 15. The South Carolina requirements for filing to become a candidate nominated by a political party primary are clear. "In order to qualify as a candidate to run in the general election, all candidates seeking nomination by political party primary . . . must file a statement of intention of candidacy between noon on March sixteenth and noon on March thirtieth." S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15.
- 16. Although certain persons are exempt from the requirement to file statements of economic interests at the same time as their statement of intention of candidacy, see S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(A), (D), and (F),² candidates seeking nomination for the House of Representatives, Senate, or countywide office are required to file their statements of

² These are individuals who have current disclosure statements on file, who are seeking to become candidates other than by filing (e.g., petition candidates), or who file for office before January 1 of the year in which the election is held are subject to different requirements for filing a statement of economic interests.

intention of candidacy with the county executive committee of their respective party. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15(2) & (3). Within five days of the receipt of the statements, but no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 30th, the county committees must transmit the statements of those individuals seeking nominiation for the House of Representatives or Senate along with the applicable filing fees to the respective state executive committees. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15(2).

17. No later than 12:00 noon on April 9^{th 3} of each general election year, the state and county executive committees must provide to the Commission written certification of the names of all persons seeking the nomination by political party primary to become candidates. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-13-40. The political parties "must verify the qualifications of those candidates prior to certification to the [Commission] of the names of the candidates to be placed on primary ballots." <u>Id.</u> Furthermore,

The written verification required by this section must contain a statement that each candidate certified meets... the qualifications for office for which he has filed. Political parties must not accept the filing of any candidate who does not ... meet the qualifications for the office for which the candidate desires to file, and such candidate's name shall not be placed on a primary ballot.

Id.

18. In considering whether individuals seeking to be nominated should be certified, political parties are also required to verify whether those individuals have complied with certain provisions of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act of 1991, as amended. Specifically, political parties must ensure that these individuals filed an SEI concurrent with their filing of an

³ If April 9th falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the state executive committee must certify the names of all candidates to be placed on the ballot no later than 12:00 noon on the following Monday. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-13-40.

SIC: "A candidate <u>must file</u> a statement of economic interests for the preceding calendar year <u>at the same time and with the same official</u> with whom the candidate files a declaration of candidacy." S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B) (emphasis supplied). ⁴ Moreover, "an officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy ... <u>may not accept a declaration of candidacy ... unless the declaration ... is accompanied by a statement of economic interests." S.C. Code § 8-13-1356(E) (emphasis supplied). If a candidate fails to file a statement of economic interests but the candidates name inadvertently appears on the ballot, "the officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy or petitions for nomination <u>must not certify</u> the candidate subsequent to the election." <u>Id.</u> (emphasis supplied).</u>

19. In addition to the clear statutory mandate, the State Election Commission, as well as the State Senate and House Ethics Committees, have made the requirement of contemporaneous filing of the statement of economic interests clear to the political parties, candidates, and the general public. The Commission advises that "Candidates must also file a Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) form with the State Ethics Commission. This must be done electronically on the State Ethics Commission website. A copy of the SEI receipt, or other proof of filing, is required to be submitted with your SIC form at the time of filing." See State Election Commission website (http://www.scvotes.org/candidate information/nomination by political party). The House of Representatives and Senate Ethics Committees provide similar information.

⁴ Individuals seeking to become candidates must file their statement of economic interests form electronically for public disclosure on the website of the South Carolina Ethics Commission. See S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-365 ("These disclosures and reports must be filed using an Internet-based filing system as prescribed by the commission."); http://ethics.sc.gov/StatementofEconomicInterests/Pages/index.aspx ("Where are the forms submitted? All Statement of Economic Interests Forms must be filed electronically . . . Upon filing, the information is immediately available to the public through public reporting, also accessed in Quick Links.").

Nevertheless, a number of candidates have been certified as candidates for the primary election without complying with these procedures.

- 20. George "Clay" Burkett is seeking the Republican nomination to become a candidate for Lexington County Coroner in the 2012 South Carolina General Election.
- 21. Upon information and belief, on or about March 26, 2012, Mr. Burkett filed an SIC with the LCRP to become a candidate for Lexington County Coroner in the 2012 South Carolina General Election by nomination through a political party. Upon information and belief, Mr. Burkett did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom he filed his SIC because he did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until April 6, 2012.
- 22. In order to qualify as a candidate to run in the general election for District 88 of the House of Representatives, Walid Hakim is seeking to become the Democratic nominee by political party primary.
- 23. Upon information and belief, on or about March 29, 2012, Mr. Hakim filed an SIC with the LCDP to become a candidate for District 88 of the House of Representatives in the 2012 South Carolina General Election by nomination through a political party. However, upon information and belief, Mr. Hakim did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom he filed his SIC. In fact, upon information and belief,

Mr. Hakim has not filed an SEI with the LCDP or any other appropriate governing body to date.

- 24. Katrina F. Shealy is seeking the Republican nomination to become a candidate for District 23 of the Senate.
- 25. Upon information and belief, on or about March 16, 2012, Ms. Shealy filed an SIC with the LCRP to become a candidate for District 23 of the Senate in the 2012 South Carolina General Election by nomination through a political party. However, upon information and belief, Ms. Shealy did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom she filed her SIC because she did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until April 12, 2012.
- 26. Upon information and belief, numerous other individuals seeking nomination to be candidates for office through the political primary process were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC.
- 27. For example, upon information and belief, Jimmy D. McMillan is seeking the Republican nomination to become a candidate for District 36 of the House of Representatives in Spartanburg County. However, Mr. McMillan failed to file a statement of economic interests until April 16, 2012—16 days after the statutory close of the filing period set forth in S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15.
- 28. Similarly, upon information and belief, Larry H. Carter Center filed an SIC with the Charleston County Democratic Party on or about March 16, 2012 to seek the Democratic nomination to become a candidate for District 114 of the House of Representatives. Even so, upon information and belief, Mr. Carter Center did not file an

SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom he filed his SIC because he did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until April 17, 2012—17 days after the statutory close of the filing period set forth in S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15.

- 29. These examples are illustrative, however, and there are other purported candidates who have not complied with the statutory requirements for becoming a candidate.
- 30. The statutory requirements for validly filing an SIC by these candidates required a contemporaneous, electronic filing of an SEI and submission of a copy of that form along with the SIC. However, upon information and belief, none of these purported candidates filed an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom they attempted to file their SIC because they did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until a date after the filing of their SIC.
- 31. Because these individuals were required but failed to file an SEI as required by S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B), these individuals did not comply with the statutorily mandated methods of becoming candidates for office by political party primary and Respondents LCDP, LCRP, SCDP and SCRP were required by statute to refuse their SIC. Moreover, because these individuals were required to file an SEI concurrently with their SIC, but failed to do so, these individuals are not qualified or eligible to seek nomination by political party primary for the respective offices and are not qualified as candidates to run in the general election.
- 32. Notwithstanding the disqualification and ineligibility of these and other individuals to seek the nomination to be a candidate for these various offices, upon information and belief, the LCDP, the LCRP, the SCDP, the SCRP, and other county

political parties accepted the deficient filings of these and other individuals and provided written certification to the State Commission or Lexington Commission that these individuals met the qualifications for the office for which the individual desired to file.

- 33. Notwithstanding the disqualification and ineligibility of these and other individuals to seek the nomination to be a candidate for these various offices, upon information and belief, the Commission or the Lexington Commission accepted the written certifications from the LCDP, the LCRP, the SCDP, the SCRP, and other county political parties certifying that these individuals met the filing requirements for which the individual desired to file.
- 34. By letter dated April 16, 2012, Plaintiff Anderson requested that the Commission, the SCDP, and the SCRP refuse or, if necessary, remove the individuals identified above who are seeking the nomination to be candidates for office through political party primaries and who were required, but failed, to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom they filed an SIC. By letter dated April 18, 2012, the Commission responded stating that it is not given the authority to determine if a candidate certified by a political party meets the qualifications to hold office or if the candidate completed the filing process properly. To date, neither the SCDP nor the SCRP has provided any response.
- 35. Upon information and belief, the State Commission, the Lexington Commission, and other county election commissions throughout South Carolina are in the process of formulating ballots which will include the name of these and other individuals who required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom they filed their SIC.

- 36. This matter implicates the validity of this State's election process and, thus, is a matter of critical public importance. A timely resolution to this question is critical to ensuring the validity of the upcoming primary elections and ensuring the validity of the general election should one of these purported candidates prevail in a primary election and appear on the general election ballot.
- 37. The Petitioners respectfully assert that such an important issue should be decided immediately by this State's highest court. Delay in this Court's adjudication of the issue could be detrimental to the integrity of the mandated election process.
- 38. The Petitioners submit that this Petition, and the complaint submitted contemporaneously with this Petition pursuant to Rule 245(c) raise an issue of significant public interest which is appropriate for adjudication by this Court in its original jurisdiction for the following reasons:
 - a. Resolution of this claim in this Court will provide needed guidance not only to the Petitioners and Respondents but to all county election parties and officials.
 - b. Resolution of this claim also will ensure the integrity of and public confidence in this state's election process.
 - c. This claim involves application of this state's election statutes to facts that Petitioners do not believe will be materially in dispute—the failure to properly file a complete SIC including an SEI and the legal ramifications and duties resulting from that failure.

In support of the this Petition, the Petitioners submit herewith a complaint and the notice to Respondent as required by Rule 245(c), SCACR, and incorporate by reference the supporting affidavits of Michael Anderson and Robert Barger and exhibits attached to the complaint as Exhibits 1 through 15.

WHEREFORE, having fully set forth their Petition, the Petitioners respectfully request that this Court grant the within Petition.

COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

The Plaintiffs come before this Honorable Court and would show as follows:

NATURE OF THE CASE

1. This action involves the pending certification of certain individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to become candidates for the South Carolina House of Representatives ("House of Representatives"), the South Carolina

Senate ("Senate") or a countywide office. The individuals identified herein were required but failed to file a Statement of Economic Interests form ("SEI") at the same time and with the same official with whom the individuals filed a declaration of candidacy for nomination as required by S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B). Consequently, these individuals did not comply with the filing requirements to become candidates for the general election by seeking nomination to these offices in the party primary currently scheduled for June 12, 2012.

2. Through this Complaint, Plaintiffs seek (a) a declaration that individuals who are not exempt under subsections 8-13-1356(A), (D), & (F) and are seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office must file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individuals filed a Statement of Intention of Candidacy form ("SIC"); (b) a declaration that an officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy for nominations under the provisions of Chapter 11 of Title 7 of the South Carolina Code may not accept an SIC unless the declaration is accompanied by a contemporaneous filing of an SEI or proof of filing of an SEI; (c) a declaration that individuals who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC did not timely file an SIC, should not be certified as a candidate to appear on the State Primary Election ballot or the State General Election ballot, are ineligible to seek the nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for that office, and are not qualified as a candidate to run in the general election for that office.

PARTIES

Plaintiffs

- 3. Plaintiff Michael Anderson is a resident and citizen of Lexington, South Carolina, and is qualified and registered to vote in the State primary election currently scheduled for June 12, 2012 ("State Primary"). By virtue of his residence, Plaintiff Anderson is qualified to vote in the State Primary for those individuals seeking nomination to become candidates for offices in Lexington County, including the office of Lexington County Coroner. See Affidavit of Michael Anderson (attached as Exhibit 1).
- 4. Plaintiff Robert G. Barger is a resident and citizen of Lexington, South Carolina, and is qualified and registered to vote in the State Primary. By virtue of his residence, Plaintiff Barger is qualified to vote in the State Primary for those individuals seeking nomination to become candidates for House of Representatives District 88 and Senate Election District 23. See Affidavit of Robert Barger (attached as Exhibit 2).

Defendants

- 5. Defendant South Carolina Election Commission ("Commission") is an agency of the government of the State of South Carolina and an entity charged with carrying out the authority conferred upon it by the South Carolina Election Law, S.C. Code Ann. § 7-1-10, et seq.
- 6. Defendant Marci Andino is the duly appointed Executive Director and representative of the Election Commission.
- 7. Defendant South Carolina Democratic Party ("SCDP") is a political party certified by the Commission to nominate candidates for offices to be voted on in a general or special election and nominates candidates of that party on a regular basis.

- 8. Defendant Richard A. Harpootlian is the duly appointed or elected Chairman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the SCDP.
- 9. Defendant South Carolina Republican Party ("SCRP") is a political party certified by the Commission to nominate candidates for offices to be voted on in a general or special election and nominates candidates of that party on a regular basis.
- 10. Defendant Chad Connelly is the duly appointed or elected Chairman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the SCRP.
- 11. Defendant Lexington County Commission of Registration and Elections ("Lexington Commission") is an agency of the government of the State of South Carolina and an entity charged with carrying out the authority conferred upon it by the South Carolina Election Law, S.C. Code Ann. § 7-1-10, et seq.
- 12. Defendant Dean Crepes is the duly appointed Executive Director and representative of the Lexington Commission.
- 13. Defendant Lexington County Democratic Party ("LCDP") is a county committee of the SCDP.
- 14. Defendant Kathy Hensley is the duly appointed or elected Chairwoman of the Executive Committee and a representative of the LCDP.
- 15. Defendant Lexington County Republican Party ("LCRP") is a county committee of the SCRP.
- 16. Defendant Steven Isom is the duly appointed or elected Chairman of the Executive Committee and a representative of Defendant LCRP.

JURISDICTION

- 17. This Court has jurisdiction over the parties and the causes of action asserted by Plaintiffs pursuant to its original jurisdiction under South Carolina Appellate Court Rule 245, S.C. Code Ann. § 14-3-310 (1976), and S.C. Const. art. V, § 5.
- 18. This Court also has jurisdiction of this case pursuant to the Uniform Declaratory Judgments Act, S.C. Code Ann. § 15-53-10 et seq. (1976, as amended) and its equitable powers.

STATUTORY BACKGROUND

- 19. The South Carolina requirements for filing to become a candidate nominated by a political party are clear. "In order to qualify as a candidate to run in the general election, all candidates seeking nomination by political party primary . . . must file a statement of intention of candidacy between noon on March sixteenth and noon on March thirtieth." S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15.
- 20. Although certain persons are exempt from the requirement to file statements of economic interests at the same time as their statement of intention of candidacy, see S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(A), (D), and (F), and (F), candidates seeking nomination for the House of Representatives, Senate or countywide office are required to file their statements of intention of candidacy with the county executive committee of their respective party. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15(2) & (3). Within five days of the receipt of the statements, but no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 30th, the county committees must transmit the statements of those individuals seeking nomination for the

¹ These are individuals who have current disclosure statements on file, who are seeking to become candidates other than by filing (e.g., petition candidates), or who file for office before January 1 of the year in which the election is held are subject to different requirements for filing a statement of economic interests.

State House of Representatives or Senate along with the applicable filing fees to the respective state executive committees. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15(2).

21. No later than 12:00 noon on April 9^{th 2} of each general election year, the state and county executive committees must provide to the Commission written certification of the names of all persons seeking the nomination by political party primary to become candidates. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-13-40. The political parties "must verify the qualifications of those candidates prior to certification to the [Commission] of the names of the candidates to be placed on primary ballots." <u>Id.</u> Furthermore,

The written verification required by this section must contain a statement that each candidate certified meets . . . the qualifications for office for which he has filed. Political parties must not accept the filing of any candidate who does not . . . meet the qualifications for the office for which the candidate desires to file, and such candidate's name shall not be placed on a primary ballot.

Id.

22. In considering whether individuals seeking to be nominated should be certified, political parties are also required to verify whether those individuals have complied with certain provisions of the South Carolina Ethics, Government Accountability, and Campaign Reform Act of 1991, as amended. Specifically, political parties must ensure that these individuals filed an SEI concurrent with their filing of an SIC: "A candidate must file a statement of economic interests for the preceding calendar year at the same time and with the same official with whom the candidate files a declaration of candidacy." S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B) (emphasis supplied).³

² If April 9th falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the state and county executive committees must certify the names of all candidates to be placed on the ballot no later than 12:00 noon on the following Monday. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-13-40.

³ Individuals seeking to become candidates must file their statement of economic interests form electronically for public disclosure on the website of the South Carolina Ethics Commission. See S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-365 ("These disclosures and reports must be filed using an Internet-

Moreover, "an officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy ... <u>may not accept</u> a declaration of candidacy ... unless the declaration ... is accompanied by a statement of economic interests." S.C. Code § 8-13-1356(E) (emphasis supplied). If a candidate fails to file a statement of economic interests but the candidates name inadvertently appears on the ballot, "the officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy or petitions for nomination <u>must not certify</u> the candidate subsequent to the election." <u>Id.</u> (emphasis supplied).

23. In addition to the clear statutory mandate, the State Election Commission, as well as the State Senate and House Ethics Committees, have made the requirement of contemporaneous filing of the statement of economic interests clear to the political parties, candidates, and the general public. The Commission advises that "Candidates must also file a Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) form with the State Ethics Commission. This must be done electronically on the State Ethics Commission website. A copy of the SEI receipt, or other proof of filing, is required to be submitted with your SIC form at the time of filing." See State Election Commission website (http://www.scvotes.org/candidate information/nomination by political party). The House of Representatives and Senate Ethics Committees provide similar information. See House of Representatives Ethics Committee website (http://www.scstatehouse.gov/ committeeinfo/houseethics.php) (referencing information made available by the South Carolina State Ethics Commission pertaining to the ethical filing requirements of candidates); Senate **Ethics** Committee (http://www.scstatehouse.gov/ website CommitteeInfo/SenateEthics.php) (same).

based filing system as prescribed by the commission."); http://ethics.sc.gov/StatementofEconomicInterests/Pages/index.aspx ("Where are the forms submitted? All Statement of Economic Interests Forms must be filed electronically . . . Upon filing, the information is immediately available to the public through public reporting, also accessed in Quick Links.").

FACTS

- 24. George "Clay" Burkett is seeking the Republican nomination to become a candidate for Lexington County Coroner in the 2012 South Carolina General Election.

 See Lexington County Republican Party website, Candidate Filing Report, March 26, 2012 (available at http://www.lexingtongop.com/lcrp-info/candidatefiling2012/thurmarch262012filings and attached as Exhibit 4).
- 25. Upon information and belief, on or about March 26, 2012, Mr. Burkett filed an SIC with the LCRP to become a candidate for Lexington County Coroner in the 2012 South Carolina General Election by nomination through a political party in the State Primary. See Gregory C. Burkett Campaign Disclosure dated April 10, 2012, Expenditures (available on the South Carolina State Ethics Commission Public Disclosure and Accountability Reporting website (http://apps.sc.gov/PublicReporting/Index.aspx) and attached as Exhibit 5). Upon information and belief, Mr. Burkett did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom he filed his SIC because he did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until April 6, 2012. See South Carolina State Ethics Commission Candidate Summary Page for Gregory C. Burkett (attached as Exhibit 6).
- 26. In order to qualify as a candidate to run in the general election for District 88 of the House of Representatives, Walid Hakim is seeking to become the Democratic nominee by political party primary. See South Carolina Democratic Party Candidate Filing Report (available online at https://docs.google.com/spreadsheet/ccc?key=0Aq6bWAPKZ0LGdG95QWIZYVJfODJKd3VITElmbXBXMGc#gid=1 and attached as Exhibit 7)

- 27. Upon information and belief, on or about March 29, 2012, Mr. Hakim filed an SIC with the LCDP to become a candidate for District 88 of the House of Representatives in the 2012 South Carolina General Election by nomination through a political party in the State Primary. See Exhibit 8. However, upon information and belief, Mr. Hakim did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom he filed his SIC. In fact, upon information and belief, Mr. Hakim has not filed an SEI with the LCDP or any other appropriate governing body to date. See South Carolina State Ethics Commission Candidate Summary Page for Walid Hakim (attached as Exhibit 8).
- 28. Katrina F. Shealy is seeking the Republican nomination to become a candidate for District 23 of the Senate. <u>See</u> Lexington County Republican Party website, Candidate Filing Report, March 16, 2012 (available at http://www.lexingtongop.com/lcrp-info/candidatefiling2012/thurmarch262012filings and attached as Exhibit 9).
- Upon information and belief, on or about March 16, 2012, Ms. Shealy 29. filed an SIC with the LCRP to become a candidate for District 23 of the South Carolina Senate in the 2012 South Carolina General Election by nomination through a political party in the State Primary. See Katrina F. Shealy Campaign Disclosure dated April 10, 2012, Expenditures (available on the South Carolina State Ethics Commission Public website (http://apps.sc.gov/ Disclosure Accountability Reporting and PublicReporting/Index.aspx) and attached as Exhibit 10). However, upon information and belief, Ms. Shealy did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom she filed her SIC because she did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until April 12, 2012. See South Carolina State Ethics Commission Candidate Summary Page for Katrina F. Shealy (attached as Exhibit 11).

- 30. Upon information and belief, numerous other individuals seeking nomination to be candidates for office through the political primary process failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC.
- 31. For example, upon information and belief, Jimmy D. McMillan is seeking the Republican nomination to become a candidate for District 36 of the House of Representatives in Spartanburg County. See South Carolina State Ethics Commission Candidate Summary Page for Jimmy D. McMillan (attached as Exhibit 12). However, Mr. McMillan failed to file a statement of economic interests until April 16, 2012—16 days after the statutory close of the filing period set forth in S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15. Id.
- 32. Similarly, upon information and belief, Larry H. Carter Center filed an SIC with the Charleston County Democratic Party on or about March 16, 2012 to seek the Democratic nomination to become a candidate for District 114 of the House of Representatives. See Exhibit 7. Even so, upon information and belief, Mr. Carter Center did not file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom he filed his SIC because he did not file an SEI with the State Ethics Commission until April 17, 2012—17 days after the statutory close of the filing period set forth in S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15. See South Carolina State Ethics Commission Candidate Summary Page for Larry H. Carter Center (attached as Exhibit 13).
- 33. These examples are illustrative, however, and there are other purported candidates who have not complied with the statutory requirements for becoming a candidate.
- 34. The statutory requirements for validly filing an SIC by these candidates required a contemporaneous, electronic filing of an SEI and submission of a copy of that

form along with the SIC. However, upon information and belief, none of these purported candidates filed an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom they attempted to file their SIC.

- 35. Because these individuals failed to file an SEI as required by S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B), the LCDP, LCRP, SCDP and SCRP were required by statute to refuse their SIC.
- 36. Because these individuals failed to file an SEI as required by S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B), these individuals did not comply with the statutorily mandated methods of becoming candidates for office by political party primary.
- 37. By virtue of the fact that these individuals were required to file an SEI concurrently with their SIC, but failed to do so, these individuals are not qualified or eligible to seek nomination by political party primary for the respective offices and are not qualified as candidates to run in the general election.

UNLAWFUL ACTIONS BY THE DEFENDANTS

- 38. Notwithstanding the disqualification and ineligibility of these and other individuals to seek the nomination to be a candidate for these various offices, upon information and belief, the LCDP, the LCRP, the SCDP, the SCRP, and other county political parties accepted the deficient filings of these and other individuals and provided written certification to the Commission or Lexington Commission that these individuals met the qualifications for the office for which the individual desired to file.
- 39. Notwithstanding the disqualification and ineligibility of these and other individuals to seek the nomination to be a candidate for these various offices, upon information and belief, the State Commission or the Lexington Commission accepted the written certifications from the LCDP, the LCRP, the SCDP, the SCRP, and other county

political parties certifying that these individuals met the qualifications for the office for which the individual desired to file.

- 40. By letter dated April 16, 2012, Plaintiff Anderson requested that the Commission, the SCDP, and the SCRP refuse or, if necessary, remove the individuals identified above who are seeking the nomination to be candidates for office through political party primaries and who were required, but failed, to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom they filed an SIC. See Letter from Tracey C. Green dated April 16, 2012 (attached as Exhibit 14). By letter dated April 18, 2012, the Commission responded stating that it is not given the authority to determine if a candidate certified by a political party meets the qualifications to hold office or if the candidate completed the filing process properly. See Letter from Marci Andino dated April 18, 2012 (attached as Exhibit 15). To date, neither the SCDP nor the SCRP has provided any response to Plaintiff Anderson.
- 41. Upon information and belief, the State Commission, the Lexington Commission, and other county election commissions throughout South Carolina are in the process of formulating ballots which will include the name of these and other individuals who failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom they filed their SIC.

FOR A FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION (Declaratory Relief)

- 42. Each and every allegation contained in the preceding paragraphs is realleged and reasserted as if set forth verbatim herein.
- 43. Plaintiffs seek a declaration that George "Clay" Burkett, Walid Hakim, and Katrina F. Shealy did not comply with the statutory procedure for becoming a candidate; were improperly certified as candidates by the LCRP, LCDP, SCRP, or SCDP,

as applicable; may not appear on the ballot for the primary election presently scheduled for June 12, 2012, and are not qualified as candidates to run in the general election.

- 44. Plaintiffs further seek a declaration from the Court that all individuals, not exempted by subsection 8-13-1356(A), (D), & (F), seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office must file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individuals filed an SIC.
- 45. Plaintiffs further seek a declaration from the Court that an officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy for nominations under the provisions of Chapter 11 of Title 7 of the South Carolina Code may not accept an SIC from an individual seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office unless the declaration or petition is accompanied by an SEI or proof of a filing of an SEI.
- 46. Plaintiffs further seek a declaration that individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC did not timely file an SIC, should not appear on the State Primary ballot, are ineligible to seek the nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office, and are not qualified as candidates to run in the general election.
- 47. Plaintiffs further seek a declaration that the LCDP, LCRP, SCDP and SCRP unlawfully certified as candidates individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC.

FOR A SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION (Injunctive Relief)

- 48. Each and every allegation contained in the preceding paragraphs is realleged and reasserted as if set forth verbatim herein.
- 49. The LCDP, LCRP, SCDP and SCRP, and other county political parties failed to comply with South Carolina's ethics and election laws by certifying to the Commission as candidates individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC.
- 50. By certifying as candidates individuals seeking nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC, the LCDP, LCRP, SCDP, and SCRP and other political parties have enabled individuals who did not timely file an SIC and thus are unqualified and ineligible to seek such nomination to be listed on the election ballot for the 2012 State Primary or to be qualified as a candidate to run in the general election.
- 51. If the Commission is permitted to approve, prepare, print, and provide to qualified voters election ballots listing the names of individuals who failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC, Plaintiffs will suffer significant and irreparable harm in that Plaintiffs will be required to participate in party primaries seeking to nominate individuals who are unqualified and ineligible to seek nomination by political party primary to be a candidate for office, who cannot be certified as the nominee, or who are not qualified as a candidate to run in the general election.

52. As a result, Plaintiffs further seek an order enjoining the Defendants from taking any further action to approve, prepare, print, or provide election ballots and from certifying, approving, printing, or distributing any 2012 primary ballots that list the names of individuals who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs pray for judgment against Defendants, providing the following relief:

- (a) For a declaratory judgment as set forth above;
- (b) That the Court enter an order enjoining the Defendants from taking any further action to print election ballots which list the names of individuals who were required but failed to file an SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed an SIC;
- (c) That the Court enter an Order enjoining the Defendants from certifying, approving, printing or distributing any 2012 ballots that list the names of individuals who were required but failed to file a SEI at the same time and with the same official with whom the individual filed a SIC; and
- (d) Such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.



All candidates, except President, seeking a political party's nomination to run in a general or special election must file a <u>Statement of Intention of Candidacy (SIC) form</u> with the appropriate party official during the appropriate filing period. <u>Click here for information on Filing for President.</u>

Candidates must also file a Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) form with the State Ethics Commission. This must be done electronically on the State Ethics Commission website. A copy of the SEI receipt, or other proof of filing, is required to be submitted with your SIC form at the time of filing. Candidates may also be required to make Campaign Disclosure reports. Visit the State Ethics Commission website for more information.

Candidates for federal office, statewide office, and solicitor must file with the state executive committee of the political party of the candidate's choice. Candidates for State Senate, State House of Representatives, countywide office, and less-than-countywide office must file with the executive committee of the county political party in the candidate's county of residence.

The filing period for the General Election opens at noon on March 16th of the election year and closes at noon on March 30th of the election year.

Names of candidates who fail to file the proper forms during the appropriate filing period will not appear on the ballot. 2012 Election Dates

Additional Candidate Filing Information Candidates who file with the Republican or Democratic parties must pay a filing fee. The filing fee is one percent of the annual salary of the office multiplied by the number of years in the term of office or \$100, whichever is greater. This fee is applied to funding the party's primary.

Contact the appropriate political party for specific information regarding filing.

If only one candidate files for a particular office with a particular party, that candidate becomes the party's nominee. When more than one candidate files for a particular office with a particular party, the nominee is chosen by primary or convention.

The Democratic and Republican parties nominate candidates by primary. Primaries to nominate candidates for the General Election are held on the second Tuesday in June. Candidates must receive a majority of votes to be nominated. If no candidate receives a majority of votes for a particular office, a primary runoff between the top two candidates is held two weeks later. Primaries and runoffs are conducted by the State and county election commissions.

The Constitution, Green,

A candidate may be nominated by more than one political party. Such candidates are commonly referred to as "fusion candidates." Click here for information regarding candidates representing more than one party.

Names of candidates who were defeated in a political party primary or convention may not appear on the ensuing general or special election ballot (S.C. Code of Laws Section 7-11-10).

Special Elections

Special elections are non-scheduled elections held at various times to fill vacancies created by death, resignation or removal from office.

The filing period for special elections opens at noon on the third Friday after the vacancy occurs and closes at noon, 10 days later.

If necessary, a primary is held on the 11th Tuesday after the vacancy occurs. If necessary, a primary runoff is held on the 13th Tuesday after the vacancy occurs. The special election is held on the 18th Tuesday after the vacancy occurs.

Partisan Municipal Elections

Filing rules for partisan municipal elections vary. Check with your local party or municipal or county election commission for specific requirements.

Please accept this request on behalf of our client, Michael Anderson of Lexington, South Carolina, to refuse or, if necessary, remove the following purported candidates from the 2012 Party Primary ballot:

Gregory "Clay" Burkett (Republican), Lexington County Coroner
Jimmy D. McMillan (Republican), State House of Representatives, District 36
Walid Hakim (Democrat), State House of Representatives, District 88
Larry Carter Center (Democrat), State House of Representatives, District 114
Katrina Shealy (Republican), State Senate District 23

These purported candidates failed to timely file a Statement of Economic Interests at the same time and with the same official with whom the candidate was required to file their declaration of candidacy pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356. Consequently, Mr. Anderson asserts that these persons have not validly declared themselves to be candidates in accordance with the provisions of S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15 and are unqualified to appear on the ballot in the upcoming South Carolina Primary Elections.

The South Carolina requirements for filing as a candidate are clear. "In order to qualify as a candidate to run in the general election, all candidates seeking nomination by political party primary . . . must file a statement of intention of candidacy between noon on March sixteenth and noon on March thirtieth." S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15. Although certain persons are exempt from the requirement to file statements of economic interests at the same time as their statement of intention of candidacy, see S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(A), (D), and (F), candidates seeking nomination for the State Senate or House of Representatives and for a countywide office are required to file their statements of intention of candidacy with the county executive committee of their respective party. S.C. Code Ann. § 7-11-15(2) and (3). Concurrently, all candidates "must file a statement of economic interests for the preceding calendar year at the same time ... the candidate files a declaration of candidacy." S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356(B) (emphasis supplied). Moreover, "an officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy ... may not accept a declaration of candidacy ... unless the declaration ... is accompanied by a statement of economic interests." S.C. Code § 8-13-1356(E) (emphasis added).

In addition to the clear statutory mandate, the State Election Commission, as well as the State Senate and House Ethics Committees, have made the requirement of contemporaneous filing of the statement of economic interests clear to the political parties, candidates, and the general public. See State Election Commission website (http://www.scvotes.org/candidate information/nomination_by_political_party: "Candidates must also file a Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) form with the State Ethics Commission. This must be done electronically on the State Ethics Commission website. A copy of the SEI receipt, or other proof of filing, is required to be submitted with your SIC the time of filing."); State Senate Ethics Committee (http://www.scstatehouse.gov/CommitteeInfo/SenateEthics.php); State House of Representatives Ethics Committee website (http://www.scstatehouse.gov/committeeinfo/ houseethics.php).

Individuals who have current disclosure statements on file, who are seeking to become candidates other than by filing (e.g., petition candidates), or who file for office before January 1 of the year in which the election is held are subject to different requirements for filing a statement of economic interests.

² Individuals seeking to become candidates must file their statement of economic interests form electronically for public disclosure on the website of the South Carolina Ethics Commission. See S.C. Code Ann. §§ 8-13-365 ("These disclosures and reports must be filed using an Internet-based filing system as prescribed by the commission."); http://ethics.sc.gov/StatementofEconomicInterests/ Pages/index.aspx ("Where are the forms submitted? All Statement of Economic Interests Forms must be filed electronically . . . Upon filing, the information is immediately available to the public through public reporting, also accessed in Quick Links.").

There can be no dispute these persons intended to offer themselves as candidates in the upcoming South Carolina Primary Election. Upon information and belief, each of these candidates were explicitly informed of the statutory mandate of filing a statement of economic interests at the same time by the County Party officials accepting the statements of intention of candidacy. In addition, upon information and belief, the place for filing statements of intention of candidacy for the Party Primary had available a computer terminal for the express purpose of filing statements of economic interests by candidates attempting to file statements of intention of candidacy. Even so, publicly available documents reflect that none of these purported candidates filed a statement of economic interests for 2011, concurrent with their statement of intention of candidacy for their respective offices:

- Mr. Burkett attempted to file for Lexington County Coroner with the Lexington County Republican Party on March 26, 2012. See Gregory C. Burkett campaign disclosure report dated April 10, 2012 ("03/26/2012 Lexington GOP PO Box 1346 Lexington, SC 29071 Filing fee \$3,362.60"); Lexington County Republican Party website (http://www.lexingtongop.com/lcrp-info/candidatefiling2012/thurmarch262012filings). However, Mr. Burkett failed to file a statement of economic interests until April 6, 2012. See Gregory C. Burkett Statement of Economic Interests Report dated April 6, 2012 (available online at http://apps.sc.gov/PublicReporting/Index.aspx).
- Mr. McMillan attempted to file for House District 36 with the Spartanburg County Republican Party. He appears not to have filed a campaign disclosure report. However, Mr. McMillan failed to file a statement of economic interests until April 16, 2012. See Jimmy D. McMillan Statement of Economic Interests Report dated April 16, 2012 (available online at http://apps.sc.gov/PublicReporting/Index.aspx).
- Mr. Hakim attempted to file for House District 88 with the Lexington County Democratic Party on March 29, 2012, (https://docs.google.com/spreadsheet/ccc?key=0Aq6bWAPKZ0LGdG95QWIZYVJfODJKd3VITEImbXBXMGc#gid=1). However, the State Ethics Commission website does not reflect that Mr. Hakim has filed a statement of economic interests. See State Ethics Commission filings for Walid N. Hakim (available online at http://apps.sc.gov/PublicReporting/Index.aspx).
- Mr. Carter Center attempted to file for House District 114 with the Charleston County Democratic Party on March 16, 2012, (https://docs.google.com/spreadsheet/ccc?key=0Aq6bWAPKZ0LGdG95QWIZYVJfODJKd3VITElmbXBXMGc#gid=1). However, the State Ethics Commission website does not reflect that Mr. Hakim has filed a statement of economic interests. See State Ethics Commission filings for Larry H. Carter Center (available online at http://apps.sc.gov/PublicReporting/Index.aspx).

Ms. Shealy attempted to file for Senate District 23 with the Lexington County Republican Party on March 16, 2012. See Katrina F. Shealy campaign disclosure report dated April 10, 2012 ("03/16/2012 Lexington GOP PO Box 1346 Lexington, SC 29071 Filing Fee \$416.00"); Lexington County Republican Party website (http://www.lexingtongop.com/lcrp-info/candidatefiling2012/fridaymarch 162012 filings); However, Ms. Shealy failed to file a statement of economic interests until April 12, 2012. See Katrina F. Shealy Statement of Economic Interests Report dated April 12, 2012 (available online http://apps.sc.gov/PublicReporting/Index.aspx).

Although three of the purported candidates filed statements of economic interests after the closing of the filing period, none filed "at the same time" as they filed their statement of intentions of candidacy. The statutory requirements for validly filing a statement of intention of candidacy by these candidates required a contemporaneous, electronic filing of a statement of economic interests. Because the statute gives no room for discretion or extension after the end of filing, the parties should not certify the candidacy of these individuals and the State Election Commission should not approve or permit the printing of ballots with these purported candidates' names to appear on the ballot where it knows the mandatory filing requirements were not met. Furthermore, each of the candidates is seeking election through the party primary system and filed after January 1, 2012, and none had a current disclosure statement on file at the time they filed their statement of intention of candidacy.

Consequently, none of the candidates is eligible for the filing exemptions contemplated by section 8-13-1356 and there can be no justification for these purported candidates' refusal to file statements of economic interests at the same time as filing their statements of intention of candidacy. Mr. Anderson, therefore, requests that the State Election Commission and the State Parties not certify these individuals as candidates for the upcoming 2012 South Carolina Party Primary elections. See S.C. Code Ann. § 8-13-1356 (E) ("If the candidate's name inadvertently appears on the ballot, the officer authorized to receive declarations of candidacy ... for nomination must not certify the candidate subsequent to the election.") (emphasis supplied).
